The 2009 EPICS User Conference was held April 19-22 in Destin, Florida. To no one's surprise, attendance was down from previous years due to the depressed state of the aluminum extrusion industry. Conference attendees took part in a "Kits and Assemblies" workshop, where they offered suggestions for fine-tuning this feature prior to its release next week.

KITS AND ASSEMBLIES FEATURE ADDED TO EPICS


For several years, one of the most requested enhancements to EPICS has been

the ability to handle kits and assemblies. The capability has now been added, and is available to all EPICS users in the V8.12 update.

Kits and assemblies can be defined in the EPICS Part table, and orders entered against them on the standard Order Entry screen. EPICS will generate workorders for the component parts (or withdraw them from stock,) and the parts can be joined together in the new Assembly



department. The final assembly or kit can be packed, shipped, and invoiced in the normal way.



Non-extrusion components can be included in a kit or assembly, and EPICS will maintain inventory and generate purchase orders and receiving reports for those components.

Detailed instructions on this new feature will be in the Help file distributed with the V8.12 update. And Scott will be announcing a Webinar on kits and assemblies later in June.

IMPROVED 'NON-EXTRUSION' ITEM HANDLING

Most EPICS users have been using the "miscellaneous invoicing" feature to track sales of scrap, touchup paint, and other non-extrusion items. As a result of features added for kits and assemblies, there is now a better way to handle these cases.

A new 'Category' field has been added to the parts table. Categories of CUSTOMER PART, STANDARD PART, COM PART, and PRICING cover Part



entries that EPICS has always had, while categories of KITS, ASSEMBLIES, and ACCESSORIES cover the new feature described in the previous article.

But the ACCESSORIES category can also be used to create Part records for touch-up paint, buffing pads, or any miscellaneous item you might sell to a customer. And the new category of SCRAP allows you to create Parts for such scrap types as butts, end scrap, and saw chips. Orders for any of these items may be entered, packed, shipped, and invoiced using the normal EPICS procedures.

MULTI-PLANT VERSION OF EPICS REVIEWED AT CONFERENCE

The Multi-plant Version of EPICS was introduced in February in the V8.11 update, but it was still a major point of discussion at the 2009 EPICS User Conference. While this new version is designed mainly for companies with multiple extrusion operations, it also contains features that will benefit plants that have remote finishing or fabrication operations.



If you have a remote finishing plant, or if you are currently running multiple EPICS programs to serve multiple plants, you should call Foy Inc to discuss how the Multi-plant version of EPICS can benefit your operation.

Features of this new EPICS version were described in more detail in the last EPICS newsletter.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDED IN THE EPICS V8.12 UPDATE


Numerous other enhancements are included in the update to be released next week, including:

- EPICS will now utilize a shorter billet for very small order-items (Recovery will be optimized for the order-item, not the billet)
- User-defined note fields have been added to allow the entry of production notes when posting production.
- When invoicing, if currency conversion rates are changed, the revenue fields are recalculated.
- Inventory fields are now copied from the Rack record to the Ticket record when packing at the press.
- Support has been added for Crystal Reports that reference multiple command objects.

OLD INVOICING SCREEN NOT AVAILABLE IN EPICS V8.12

As we have stated in the last couple of newsletters, the old Invoicing screen is finally disappearing. Before you upgrade to EPICS V8.12, make sure that your invoicing personnel are using the new improved screen (shown here)



The Advanced Invoicing screen allows you to see all items on an invoice on one screen, and is similar in appearance and function to the Order Entry screen.
